Message from the Headmaster



1 - Gary O'Shea

At this year's Senior Prizegiving I began my report with this paragraph:

"12 years ago, I stood in this same spot on stage in the same gown and hood and I gave my first Headmaster's address. At that time in 2006 the boys in the front row this evening were just entering school as 4 or 5-year olds. So, as I began my journey as Headmaster 12 years ago they began their 12 years of school education. Just as they have seen huge changes so have I".

Twelve years has certainly flown by and there have been many individual highlights including increased roll growth, back to back Education Review Office 4-5 Year Reviews, strong academic and co-curricular achievements and a positive school climate, reinforcing a genuine sense of belonging amongst the boys, staff and stakeholders.

I have been privileged to have led and been part of this College's growth, and I am proud of our progress throughout this time.

#### **Academic Performance**

The boys continue to perform well above the National averages in all areas of academic attainment including NCEA, Trade Qualifications, Scholarship and Cambridge Examinations. The broad achievement benchmark targets set by the Ministry of Education for all New Zealand schools for 2017 are close to being achieved.

Academic achievement highlights include: -

#### **Core MOE National Targets for all Students**

- By 2017 that 85% of all 18 year old New Zealand adults will have attained a minimum NCEA Level 2 or equivalent qualification.
- Nelson College 83% overall with (86%) NZE and (68%) Maori exited with a minimum NCEA Level 2 attained.

#### Scholarship

• 13 Scholarships were gained in 2016.

#### Trades / ITO's qualifications.

- Courses include Building & Construction, Automotive-Mechanical/Industrial Engineering,
- Design Metal & Wood, and Electronics.
- In 2016 a total of 415 students achieved an average pass rate of 87.2%.

#### **Co-Curricula Performance**

In 2016/2017 Nelson College students have continued to achieve success nationally and been selected for international honours (a full list is included in this edition of the Bulletin).

#### **Old Boys & Community Contribution**

Thank you to Old Boys who have contributed in a multitude of ways in support of boys participation in the College, including the recent trip to the United Kingdom for Rugby School's 450th celebrations. Thank you to the following who have made contributions or who are sole funding significant projects which include:

- Matakitaki Lodge upgrades and equipment (funded by the Christchurch OBA branch and Owen Bequest)
- Junior Elite Football Academy (funded by Sir Peter Vela)
- The College's Whare has a carved façade now in place using totara wood sourced from the West Coast and the Chapman Bequest Interest fund will be used to complete this project and to purchase waka-ama canoes for the College's sports programme.
- John & Sir Geoffrey Palmer and the contribution from the Palmer fund, which supports the Teaching Staff Professional Development programme.

- The Lamb Family, who support Environmental Education courses and the Lamb Environmental Centre.

#### **Special Project**

#### **Boarding Re-Development**

I am pleased to announce continued progress on the most important infrastructure project in the last 80 years of our history.

- Work is finished on the Barnicoat refurbishment and the boys have occupied their modernised facility throughout this year.
- The development of the Rutherford Hostel is now underway with a completion date of October 2018 and junior boys to move in for the final six weeks of the 2018 school year.
- The Fell hostel will become a hostel facility for external hireage from October 2018, and its modernisation plan will be staged over several years and be funded by the hospitality and hireage income areas.

#### Around the World

#### FRANCE FOR FREEMAN

**Dick Freeman (1947-52)** writes from France, where he has spent most of his life, particularly in Alsace.

Alsace is a region which has long been disputed between France and Germany. When I first arrived here it was not uncommon to meet locals who had changed nationalities several times. Happily those days are gone. With a new bridge across the Rhine we can be in Germany rapidly by car or cycle. Even one of the tram lines in Strasbourg which I take frequently has its terminus now across the river in Kehl.

There are four languages in the family, French, English, German and Spanish, but no one speaks all four. My compagne is Alsacienne and like many of her kind speaks French and German as well as the local dialect. My four children who were born in England, France or New Zealand, were educated in

France so are naturally bilingual but the next generation is dominantly Anglophone. However language is not a real barrier within the family. We get along fine when we are together...

# **ALTERNATIVE LIFE DIRECTION**

I attended Nelson College 1960 to 1963, boarder at Rutherford House. My main interest was in art, with tutor Barbara Wilks being a strong influence in my life and directions later. I was something of a misfit at college. Very shy, I found it hard to mix or speak in public. Spent numerous hours in the library, probably read every book! Was on the college museum committee which gave me a 'hiding place' and a collection to contemplate. Made friends at the Nelson Provincial Museum. Spent my holidays working at Dalgety's wool and grain store, the salt works near Seddon and the Canterbury Museum. Nelson College forced me to mingle with boys from a different social strata which later I appreciated. I left college without qualifications.

Grew up on a Marlborough farm with lots of wild hills nearby, to hunt and explore. I knew nature intimately which taught me acute observational skills. As the eldest son of a farmer it was assumed I would be a sheep farmer ! I escaped Marlborough at 18 years old and ended up in Swede n, dish washing, factory work and conservation work on the warship 'Wasa' 1628 AD., through the Swedish Nat. Museum, Stockholm.

Initially I became involved in museum and archaeology work in the Canterbury Museum, Dominion Museum (Te Papa now) and then overseas museums. Later I worked in set and graphic design for NZBC., then NZ Nat. Film Unit. Took up bone and jade carving in 1968 which led into tutoring carving in various institutions, in and out of NZ. Taught part time for 28 years at Whitireia Polytechnic, Porirua. Lecturing on the subject of New Zealand. Carving overseas at conferences, etc. Invited to present research papers (with exhibition) at conferences of the "Worked Bone Research Group" sub group of International Council of Archae-zoology, in Salzburg, then Zhengzhou, China, last year a presentation to the New Zealand Jade Artists Society in Hokitika, while a judge for their show.

Now a retrospective exhibition "50 years Carving" at Pataka Gallery, Porirua, next year 2018.

My work is held in various museum collections including Te Papa National Museum.

"To our left was the theatre, basking in the morning sun, whereas on our right, some of the local men had sought refuge under a shady tree. In 2006, she published her story in the book "Married to a Bedouin" which to date has been translated into more than fifteen languages.

A special moment came at the VIP service for New Zealanders at the Wood of Peace project when the names were read out of the five families present represented by direct family – Nelson College was named as the family of Donovan Hill – a very special moment.

#### **MATAKI - 50 YEARS AGO**

Mataki Lodge was officially opened by His Excellency the Governor-General, Sir Bernard Fergusson on 29 May 1967. For those attending from Nelson there was a 98-mile trip by road, for the Vice Regal party, the journey was much shorter and more comfortable, the trip being made by helicopter from Trafalgar Park - where two helicopters were used.

#### *The Mataki Incident* refers to issues related to the Truck

"The truck has been a tremendous asset, enabling Masters to ferry boys down the road to and from their points of departure on tramps....We have had a certain amount of tyre trouble and fuel trouble but these are in the process of being remedied. We have found that the driving wheels will not grip in any sort of greasy or soft going, mainly because, when the truck is empty, the front is disporportionately heavy. We propose to carry a ton or two of stones in the truck to correct this, and one of the Masters is in the process of making a set of chains......."

We are fortunate that Old Boy **Martin Heine (1963-67)** kept his diary notes and photo slides from the 1966-67 period. A few of his photo slides are shown above, along with an excerpt from his diary.

He recounts:

Mataki Valley Trip 21-25 November 1966

This was the first school party to visit the Mataki area, and as the lodge had only the foundations laid, we camped below a terrace in the Mole Stream.

Numerous entries for each day are noted with detail.

MatakiLodge 15-17 May 1967

This was a holiday familarisation course for future leaders.

Monday 15th

Party arrived at Lodge. Little activity as snow fell all day.

Tuesday 16th

The whole party went up to Mole Creek, and lunched at Mole Hut. After lunch Mr Boyd and Ross Richards looked around the Mole Saddle and the rest of us leaving the Mole Hut at 1.00pm, went onto the Mole Tops and into Watson's Creek to reach the hut at 3.50. There were many deer and chamois tracks on the snow, and one chamois was sighted. We left Watsons at 4.20 and arrived in the Matakitaki

Valley at 5.50pm - just on dusk. After walking down the road and over the Watson's Creek shingle fan, we were picked up by Mr Boyd and returned to the Lodge.

26 October 1967 6B1 Mataki Trip

A group of us had a swotting break at Mataki and combined it with an overnight trip to the fly camp above Peak Creek.

#### **A Reflection**

My skinny build precluded me from being part of the dominant rugby/cricket sporting codes apart from forays into fives and crosscountry running. My weekends were often spent tramping and shooting in the backcountry, engendered by my family culture of outdoor activity. There was also a college tramping club which had a number of outings in 1966 lead by teacher Don Burrage.

"When Mataki Lodge arrived I could put my experience to some use and really enjoyed visits there. It all helped foster my future life as a National Park Ranger and Conservation Manager."
