Kia ora koutou,

Thank you all for supporting us through another year in boarding. Again, it has been busy year of challenges, as well as positive highs.

After an eventful year that included a boarding restructure over summer, closures, COVID and winter flu in high numbers, and a kitchen fire in spring, term four continued to be an exciting and emotional time for boarding.

The term started with the 10th anniversary of our boarders' sports tour of the West Coast. This tour began as a result of one of our boarders Matt Gunter passing away. He lived in Greymouth. To keep the connection strong with his family, and to honour his memory, the tour began a decade ago with a rugby game in Greymouth each October. This has now developed into over 60 boys playing basketball, football and rugby in numerous games down 'the Coast.' The most significant game is the senior rugby game held in Greymouth for the Matthew Gunter Shield. This year, it was Nelson College Boarders turn to bring it home. Nelson College Boarding continues to mourn the loss of Matt and to very much value our enduring relationship with Matt's parents Heather and David.

Old Man' Supper was held the week before seniors left. This is our traditional end of year boarding dinner that involves boys and staff from both houses. The 'old man' refers to the headmaster who originally ran boarding as an additional income stream, as well as to provide for the schooling needs of the wider rural community. He housed the boarders in the main school and at the end of each year, treated them to a 'Christmas-type' dinner out of his own pocket.

Old Man's Supper is now usually held in the dining room, but this year we held it on the grass at the front of Barnicoat House. It's a chance to celebrate finishing another year in boarding, and to acknowledge and farewell our leavers; in particular, our year 13 boys. This dinner finishes with a haka to acknowledge and farewell all leavers.

Our house dinners closely followed Old man's Supper. These dinners were both held at Trailways in town and again, they were a chance to acknowledge key achievements over the year, and to farewell leavers 'in house.' It was great to have so many of our boarding parents attend these dinners.

Alongside these end of year traditions, boarding also managed to pull off an impressive win in the haka competition, which, when added to our results in other events throughout the year, has enabled boarding to win the Neale Cup for the school's Interhouse Competition 2022. We are very proud of the efforts of our year 13 leaders in organising the boys through all events in this competiton, and for all boarders in their commitment to representing our community within the wider school context.

2022/3 Staffing Changes

Lucy Burns became Barnicoat House's matron this year with the resignation of Holly Garnett. Lucy was already a cleaner at Barnicoat, and so her tranisition into the matron role has been smooth and positive.

Johnnie Fraser departed boarding after 18 years as a Barnicoat supervisor. He and wife Vikki made a significant contribution to boarding during their time with us and we truly appreciate all they have given. Both Johnnie and Vikki remain working at Nelson College. Johnnie was replaced in Barnicoat by Michael Hayes. Michael has extensive boarding experience from around New Zealand, and we have very much appreciated how quickly he has involved himself within our community. Michael also works in the day school as a teacher aide.

Tracy McLaren joined Rutherford House as a supervisor this year. Tracy is the Learning Support Coordninator at Hampden Street School and next year she begins as housemaster for Rutherford House. Tracy has made a positive contribution to boarding this year; in particular, she has demonstrated very strong pastoral relationships with the boys. We wish her all the best in her new role.

Andrew Yorkstone also joined boarding in 2022. Andrew is teacher in charge of music at Nelson College, and his support of boarding as an across house supervisor has been appreciated.

Boarding has also appreciated the positive input of old boys Punn Cowarin and Noah Hassan.

Boarding concluded 2022 with farewelling Andrew Yorkstone as a supervisor, Alex Hassan as a housemaster and Samme Hippolite as Director of Boarding. These staff will continue to teach at Nelson College in 2023.

Alex needs to be acknowledged for the her unwavering commitment to Rutherford House, as well as a genuine desire to see boarding as an entire community thrive. She has shown much resilience in the three years she has been housemaster of Rutherford. She came into the position with no boarding experience here, and at a time when things were not straightforward; and she very quickly came to grips with the job that needed to be done and how to do it.

I leave boarding after four years in the role. I had one key goal back in December 2018 when I began, and that was to restore boarding's pride and place at Nelson College, by making it a safe, positive, and unified community. I knew the key ingredient to achieving our goal was the people. Everything moving forward had to be anchored in safe and positive relationships. Despite many challenges along the way, boarding is now a thriving community, and I would like to thank everyone who has been involved over the past few years and wish everyone all the very best moving forward.

Important Nelson College Boarding & School Information Reminders

BYOD

BYOD is compulsory for all students at Nelson College.

All relevant information for you is now on the Nelson College website under BYOD at Nelson College.

Website/Electronic Access

The college encourages parents to visit our website www.nelson.school.nz to keep up to date with current information. The website also provides a parent sign-in to our secure web environment, where parents and caregivers can access information to keep them informed of their son's learning progress, including attendance, timetables, report, achievement data and daily notices. Students will be able to access the same information as well as many learning resources and information via Ultranet. Any problems with not having access to these portals, please contact our student office.

Cell Phones

Cell phones are to be turned off and out of sight in class. Texting is not permitted during class time.

Phones will be confiscated and handed to the deputy principals & deans if these rules are not followed.

Attendance/Absences

All students are expected to be in their timetabled class. This will be monitored, and parents contacted when students are not present. If a boarding student is absent, it is important that the housemaster & school are notified. Please either complete the <u>Online Form</u> or email <u>attendance@nelsoncollege.school.nz</u> or call the attendance line on 548 3099. Please leave the student's name, the reason for their absence and if known, how long they will be absent. On returning to school, boys need to collect a pink slip from the attendance office to show to their teachers. <u>Click here for full attendance guidelines.</u> Failure to provide a note will result in the student being disciplined and the parents contacted.

Parents who wish to take their son(s) on holiday during term time need to contact the year level dean.

Sick/Illness

Boarding students who feel unwell during the school day are expected to report to reception. Once assessed, they may then be admitted for care to the sick bay or sent back to their house under the care of the matron.

Unwell boys will be cared for initially by house staff in their boarding house. They will also be supported in making medical appointments when necessary. If boys are seriously unwell or need to be away from school for several days, they are expected to return home.

Appointments

Appointments should not be arranged during school time. If this is unavoidable, there is a procedure that boys need to complete before they are granted leave.

Students should bring a written request for leave to the attendance office for a pink slip, which they then show to their teachers.

Off Site

It is a college rule that no pupil leaves the school grounds at lunchtime unless they have the permission of the deputy principals. The neighbouring dairy and bakery are <u>out of bounds</u> during interval and lunchtime.

Change of Address

Please inform the Student Office of any changes to address, phone numbers or email.

Leaving Procedures

All students leaving college during the year, at the end of year or transferring to another school, must complete formal signing out procedures. Leaving forms are available from the student office.

<u>Uniform</u>

The Board of Trustees, and college community have affirmed that Nelson College is a school that wants a uniform and that it should be worn well.

Uniform helps instil a sense of identity and purpose. Self-esteem is enhanced by wearing a uniform with pride. Uniform should be worn in accordance with the attached guidelines.

- Shorts need to be pulled up appropriately.
- Socks must be up (blue socks are beginning to be introduced, grey socks are still acceptable).
- Blue polo shirts may be out (all other shirts tucked in).
- If students choose to wear a belt, it should be dark blue or black.
- Singlets and/or polypropylene vests are recommended in winter but should be short sleeved and not visible.
 - It is not acceptable to wear:
- Mufti clothing & beanies / jandals /running shoes/cross trainers etc.
- College sports jackets /Any visible jewellery.
- Long-sleeved polyprops (unless under a long-sleeved shirt) /cap (unless college).
 Hair (personal grooming)
- Neat and tidy hair.
- Colour should a natural shade, uniform (no multiple colours) and that is acceptable to the management of the school.
- No dreadlocks, mohawks, 'rats' tails', and designs/logos cut into the hair.
- Facial hair is not accepted. Students must be clean shaven except during 'Movember'.

Parents are encouraged to seek the college leadership's guidance if they are concerned their son's proposed hair style might be unacceptable.

2023 Nelson College Boarding Fees & School Expenses

SOARDING FEES AND EXPENSES 2023	
Deposit to Secure a Boarding Place - A deposit of \$1,000 (NZ) is to be paid when accepting a boarding place at Nelson College. This deposit is credited to the student's invoice for boarding fees. In those ases where the acceptance is subsequently declined by the parent, the deposit may be forfeited except at the discretion of the Director of Boarding. This must be paid by 20 th November of the year preceding entry.	\$1,000
full Board - Boarding Fees are \$15,900.00 per annum including GST and will be charged over the nine months, \$1,766.67 per month. The first payment will be on 20 th February and ast payment 20 th October.	\$15,900 \$1,766.67 charged per month over 9 months
You may receive two accounts every month for your son. One account is the Boarding Account' which includes all charges related to boarding and includes boarding fees, house canteen, house photos etc. The second account is the 'Day Achool Account' which includes all charges relating to sports trips and subs, school rips etc associated with the Day School.
