Congratulations to the Nelson College team who have qualified for NZSS Nationals with wins against Marlborough 4-0 and Nayland 7-0 in their National Qualifiers. Preparation for the top-level Secondary School Football Tournament involved a four-game trip to Wellington in the lead-up to the National Tournament in Christchurch this Year.

Our first Game was against Rongotai College and Jay Anderson soon established the lead. After an intense game, Rongotai scored in a last-minute equaliser. **Final Score 1-1.**

The next fixture was against Scots College on outstanding facilities in New Town. The boys were keen to play this team who are linked with Premier League side Tottenham Hotspur.
