#### Sign into School Portal

1. Go to: [Nelson College Website](#) click **PORTAL**
2. Click 'Sign In' and then choose your account type "Caregiver".
3. Caregivers with a Facebook, Google, Microsoft/Hotmail or a Yahoo account can use one of these options to sign in. The email address used with one of these services must be the same email address you have registered with the school.

#### Caregivers Sign in with Magic Code

Caregivers without a Facebook, Google or Microsoft or Yahoo account, can sign in by requesting a Magic Sign-In email. These emails are valid for 72 hours and you can request a new one at any time.

1. To receive a Magic Sign-In email, enter your school-registered email address and click the send button.
2. You will receive an email that includes a Magic Sign-In link that you can click to sign in, as well as a Magic Sign-In code that you can use to sign in on a different device
3. Click the Magic Sign-In Link for the student you want to sign in for and you will be automatically signed in.

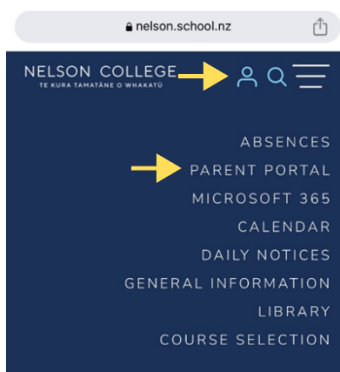

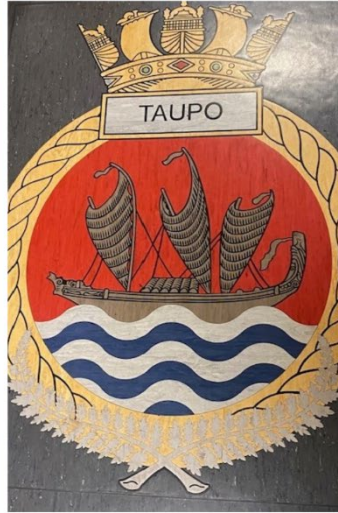
## Industry Profile: NZDF: Navy

On Monday Careers Advisor, Vikki Heays went on a reconnaissance mission with The New Zealand Navy to scope out opportunities for students wishing to pursue that career pathway. Here's her report:

On Monday I was lucky enough to be invited on board the HMNZS Taupo, and to be taken out on a patrol in the Tasman Bay on a crazy wild windy day. While on board, the crew conducted a man overboard exercise, a fire in the hold exercise, and I got to talk to people in a variety of roles in the Navy. It was really interesting to see the diversity of trades and roles, from electricians to divers to gunners!

I met people who had joined the Navy straight from school, others who had gone to uni and then joined up, some who were using the Navy as a Gap year or two while they figured out their next move, and others who had made it their career.

Their “why” for joining was interesting too – for some, it was leadership development, others it was the sense of team and belonging, others it was the money and the perks, and for some it was to experience travel. I loved the high-speed trip back into town on the zodiac-style boat – it made me feel like in was in a James Bond movie! ## 11GEO Forestry Field Trip

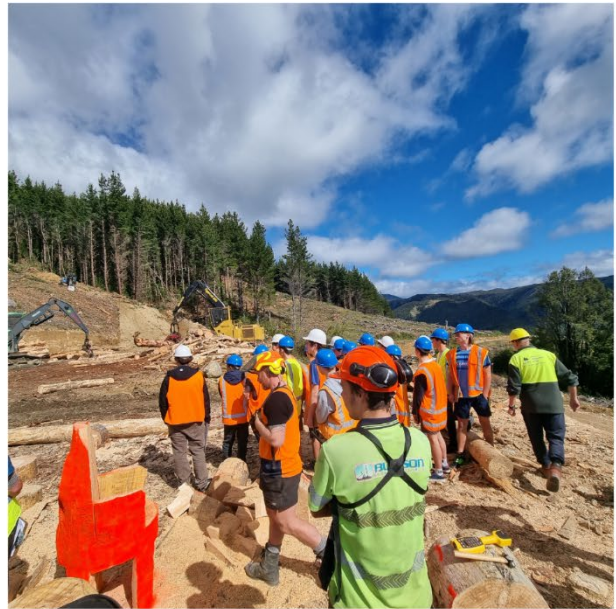
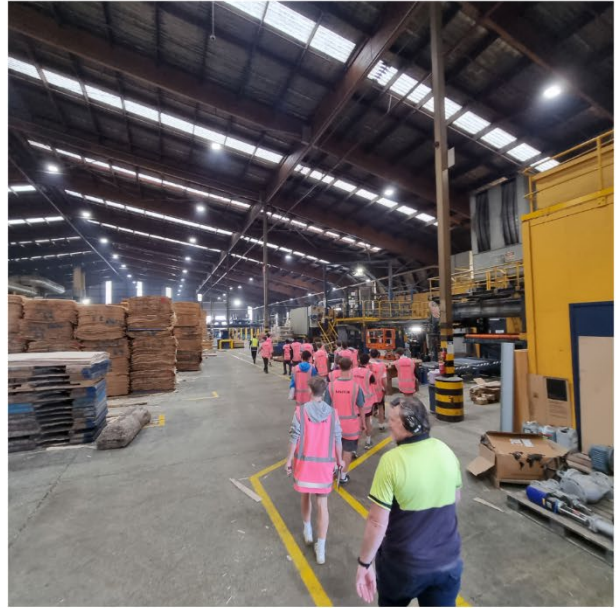
Last week, Year 11 Geography embarked on a field trip to learn more about the forestry industry in Nelson Tasman. The field trip is linked to our topic investigating the sustainability of using land in our region for forestry. The goal of the trip was for the students to see first-hand some of the key aspects of how the industry operates in our region.

Our first stop was ArborGen Nursery in Spring Grove. Here we were hosted by the manager of the nursery, Russel Brown. Russel has a vast amount of experience, not just within tree nurseries, but also within the wider forestry industry. He helped students understand how the process of forestry begins with seeds grown in the nursery into seedlings over a period of about nine months, before being sold on to companies for planting in forests within the Nelson Tasman region.

We then ventured out to Riwaka Forest. Here we were taken on a tour of an operational harvesting site by Craig McMiken and John Webster from Tasman Forest Management. This was a unique opportunity to access a skid site where over \$3 million worth of equipment was being used by a crew of eight people to harvest and process trees in a very challenging environment. Craig and John went the extra mile to provide the students with a thorough understanding of the challenges associated with harvesting sites like this and the many efforts being made to reduce negative impacts of the harvesting process.

The class's final site visit was to the Nelson Pine Industries factory just out of Richmond. Here the students were led on a tour by Craig, Matt and Leona through the factory which helped them understand how raw logs from our region's forests have value added to them as they are processed into LVL or MDF products. These products are then either sold domestically or exported overseas via Port Nelson.

All-in-all this was an immensely valuable day out for the students, providing them with a wealth of information about many aspects of our regional forestry industry. Thanks to everyone who hosted us at each site. Also, many thanks to Joe Haddon, who took time away from his own classes to provide support on the field trip.



## Cultural Diversity Day

Our school was alive with the sights, sounds and smells of the world today for Cultural Diversity Day. Following on from our 'learn a language' session in the library where students gave staff an introduction to their mother tongue, we counted a whopping 15 languages, diversity day is our way of giving our non-New Zealand students a time to shine and to say thanks for making us the interesting and energetic place that is Nelson College.

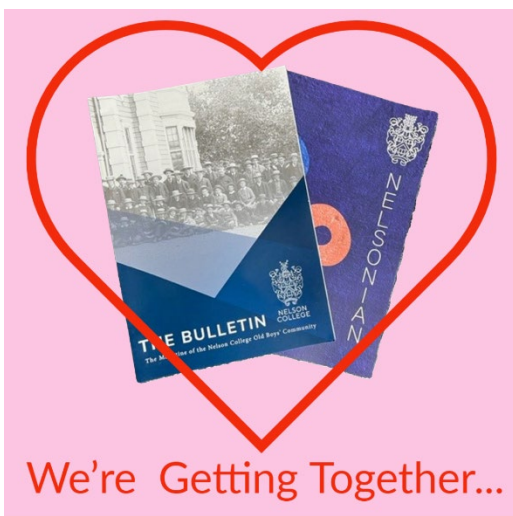

**NBTS -Nelson Bays Team Sailing Association** is an incorporated society providing the opportunity for school students to participate in Teams Sailing. With a dedicated coach and fleet of twelve Olympic class 420 yachts based out of the Nelson Yacht Club, summer is sorted. 420 yachts are a class of two-person boats that are agile and fun to sail and a good stepping-stone to other sailing classes.

**What is Teams Racing?** Six sailors, with one or two reserves, form a team. In Teams Racing, two teams of three boats each, race against each other. Each team represents their school. They race over a short complex course, which covers all the different sailing angles and takes an average of 10-15 minutes to complete. Skippers and crew develop a high level of sailing knowledge. Anticipating the wind, tides and other team member's intentions are crucial abilities needed to be a successful team.

To win a race, a combined finish result of 10 points or less (based on the boat position across the finish line results) is required. The first boat past the finish line gets one point – and the sixth six points.

**College Teams.** Most Colleges in Nelson / Tasman have either one or two sailing teams. Training is after school during terms 4 and 1 of the school year with schools allocated different afternoons (3.30pm – 6.30pm):

**MONDAY** - Waimea College  
**TUESDAY** – Nelson College for Girls  
**WEDNESDAY** – Garin College  
**THURSDAY** – Nayland College  
**FRIDAY** – Nelson College

Inter-school racing takes place each Sunday in the Nelson harbour (terms 4 & 1).

**Safe environment.** NBTS offers a safe and healthy environment for students. NBTS has detailed health & safety standard operating procedures, which are updated on a regular basis, as required by law.

**Coaching.** To ensure the students are correctly instructed, safely and with respect for the boats, NBTS has a qualified coach for the summer season. This season we are thrilled to have Patrick Harris as our coach for a second season.

Patrick has sailed competitively in many classes and was the Kerikeri high school team captain for team sailing.

**Cost & more information.** The NBTS fee for this season is \$180 per term (there are two terms in the season; term 4 2023 and term 1 2024). To join Team sailing, sailors also need to join the Nelson Yacht Club as a youth member and have completed a learn to sail course prior. This is not a "learn to sail" sport. Learn to Sail Level 1 is the minimum entry requirement. You can do this course at the Nelson Yacht Club <http://www.nelsonyachtclub.org.nz/>

**Regattas.** This season the regional top of the south regatta will be held in Nelson at the Nelson Yacht Club (14<sup>th</sup> – 16<sup>th</sup> March 2024). Nationals will be held in New Plymouth (21<sup>st</sup> – 26<sup>th</sup> April 2024).
