## **Nelson College Trust Foundation Update**

The Nelson College Trust Foundation has met twice this year, with a general meeting and AGM in April and another general meeting in October. In 2022, with the express permission of donors, we reallocated most of the endowment funds into new fund categories with the intention of ensuring the Foundation remains relevant to the needs of the College moving forward. Future donors will have the opportunity to contribute to either an Endowment Fund (where the capital is preserved) or a Special Purpose Fund (created for ongoing or specific projects where capital and income are available for distribution). The current range of Endowment Fund categories covers property, sports, arts, academic and cultural pursuits. We have only one Special Fund at present – which supports travel costs for boys representing the College (regionally, nationally, or internationally) in academics, sport or arts & culture.

The Foundation has also updated its annual distribution policy to provide more consistent financial support to the College, rather than allocations subject to volatile market returns. The filtering method adopted is commonly used by large endowment funds around the globe.

All Trustees are elected representatives of their stakeholder groups (two from the BOT, two from the Old Boys, two from the PTA and two independents). The two parent representatives previously appointed by the PTA, have been re-elected in a transition capacity by the incumbent Trustees, after the dissolution of the PTA in 2022. The intention of the original Trust Deed was to have two representatives of the Parent Body on the Foundation and it is proposed that these positions be filled via election from the same stakeholders in the future. We are currently working through the most effective way to do this in 2024.

We would love to see you there supporting both the schools in action and the lovely Gunter family for these exciting games.





## **Social Studies**











At the end of Term 3, Year 10 Social Studies students shared their vision for Nelson with local politicians and experts. Deputy Mayor Rohan O'Neill Stevens and MP Rachel Boyack, along with professionals Ross McPhie and William Rae from Stantec Civil Engineers, Rebecca Dawkins and Paul Shattock from Nelson City Council, and Alan Gray from Boffa Miscall, all provided positive feedback.

One group suggested enhancing safety on Waimea, Hampden, and Franklin Streets with raised crossing tables, bike lanes, and limited parking for school drop-offs. They addressed concerns of children crossing busy roads and cyclists needing clear pathways through intersections.

Another group proposed upgrading the Basin Reserve to create a valuable recreation area, connecting it to a boardwalk on the opposite side of the road to improve waterfront access. Both presentations aimed to make Nelson more youth-friendly by addressing the lack of affordable CBD activities. This would create a more inclusive and accessible environment for all ages.

## **Goldpine Site Visit**













As our students come to the end of the year, they are becoming interested in seeing careers in action. Site visits are important for students to gain some understanding of what work is really like. This term three students got the opportunity to have a site visit to Goldpine, Golden Downs, who produce posts and poles for the NZ market.

NBTS -Nelson Bays Team Sailing Association is an incorporated society providing the opportunity for school students to participate in Teams Sailing. With a dedicated coach and fleet of twelve Olympic class 420 yachts based out of the Nelson Yacht Club, summer is sorted. 420 yachts are a class of twoperson boats that are agile and fun to sail and a good steppingstone to other sailing classes.

What is Teams Racing? Six sailors, with one or two reserves, form a team. In Teams Racing, two teams of three boats each. race against each other. Each team represents their school. They race over a short complex course, which covers all the different sailing angles and takes an average of 10-15 minutes to complete. Skippers and crew develop a high level of sailing knowledge. Anticipating the wind, tides and other team member's intentions are crucial abilities needed to be a successful team.

To win a race, a combined finish result of 10 points or less (based on the boat position across the finish line results) is required. The first boat past the finish line gets one point and the sixth six points.

College Teams. Most Colleges in Nelson / Tasman have either one or two sailing teams. Training is after school during terms 4 and 1 of the school year with schools allocated different afternoons (3.30pm - 6.30pm):

MONDAY - Waimea College TUESDAY - Nelson College for Girls WEDNESDAY - Garin College THURSDAY - Nayland College FRIDAY - Nelson College

Inter-school racing takes place each Sunday in the Nelson harbour (terms 4 & 1).

Safe environment, NBTS offers a safe and healthy environment for students. NBTS has detailed health & safety standard operating procedures, which are updated on a regular basis, as required by law.

Coaching. To ensure the students are correctly instructed, safely and with respect for the boats, NBTS has a qualified coach for the summer season. This season we are thrilled to have Patrick Harris as our coach for a second season.

Patrick has sailed competitively in many classes and was the Kerikeri high school team captain for team sailing.

Cost & more information. The NBTS fee for this season is \$180 per term (there are two terms in the season; term 4 2023 and term 1 2024). To join Team sailing, sailors also need to join the Nelson Yacht Club as a youth member and have completed a learn to sail course prior. This is not a "learn to sail" sport. Learn to Sail Level 1 is the minimum entry requirement. You can do this course at the Nelson Yacht Club http://www.nelsonyachtclub.org.nz/

Regattas. This season the regional top of the south regatta will be held in Nelson at the Nelson Yacht Club (14th - 16th March 2024). Nationals will be held in New Plymouth (21st -26th April 2024).
