We are now well and truly back in the business of focused teaching and learning after a very smooth, if a little warm, start to the year. Our 2023 NCEA results are most satisfying with our students performing well above the national achievement averages in Levels 1, 2, and 3. We also performed at a similar or above level for schools with the same Equity Index (EQI). Equity Index measures the socio-economic background of the total student population.

Approximately one third of our students achieved at Merit and Excellence standard in Levels 1, 2, and 3. We are determined to keep improving our academic standards and we will be setting subject targets so that our young men can have "stretch" goals.

Without goals, self-improvement is difficult so I would encourage all parents to take the time to discuss the importance of academic application and effort; good study habits can never be established too early, and they do make a difference beyond school.

mobile phone policy

Recently the Board ratified our mobile phone policy in line with the Government mandates. The Ministry of Education website provides guidelines which can be found in the following link; https://www.education.govt.nz/school/digital-technology/cellphones/

Thank you to all parents and caregivers who responded to our option preference last week. 90% of respondents favoured the "away for the day" option meaning students will be allowed to bring their mobile phones to school, but they must be switched off and stored safely for the duration of the normal school operating hours i.e. 8.45 am until 3.15 pm. This is the option the school will be adopting and from now on our <u>school policy</u> will be enacted.

I have never been a great supporter of government mandates in relation to teaching and learning (apart from a sound national curriculum and an effective assessment regime) but in the case of prohibiting mobile phone use during the school day, I believe students will be better off socially and learning outcomes will be improved.

Many schools, both in New Zealand and overseas, have already prohibited the use of mobile phones and, without exception, both students and teachers report improved outcomes. The reported benefits are manyfold.

They include;

- Improved classroom focus and attention span
- Significant reduction of cyberbullying
- Avoidance of unnecessary time-wasting social media contact
- More face-to-face interaction and improved interpersonal skills
- · Reduction in student anxiety and stress
- Reduction in cyber-security risks

More interesting however, is that the great majority of schools reported improved academic outcomes and improved school culture and climate. Both teachers and students did not want to go back to the "mobile days"!

Thank you for your support of this policy and, again, I would encourage you to have a discussion with your son(s) about some of the benefits listed above.

Sign into School Portal

- 1. Go to: Nelson College homepage click PORTAL
- 2. Click 'Sign In' and then choose your account type "Caregiver".
- 3. Caregivers with a Facebook, Google, Microsoft (or Hotmail) or a Yahoo account can use one of these options to sign in quickly and securely. The email address used with one of these services must be the same email address you have registered with the school.

Caregivers Sign in with Magic Code

Caregivers without a Facebook, Google or Microsoft or Yahoo account, can sign in by requesting a Magic Sign-In email. These emails are valid for 72 hours and you can request a new one at any time.

- 1. To receive a Magic Sign-In email, enter your school registered email address and click the send button.
- 2. You will receive an email that includes a Magic Sign-In link that you can click to sign in, as well as a Magic Sign-In code that you can use to sign in on a different device
- 3. Click the Magic Sign-In Link for the student you want to sign in for and you will be automatically signed in.

MATCH REPORT: The Willows v Nelson College 4th February 2024

The Nelson College Fixture is a match that is always highly anticipated, for many reasons, but mainly because Nelson College is our founder Mike Dormer's old school. Nelson College brought a strong side to The Willows, captained by Kurt Ward.

The Willows won the toss and elected to bat and were soon in early trouble at 56/4 – the position worsened to 68/5 before Louie Garry and Micha Walther joined in a sixth wicket partnership of 107, to add a great deal of respectability to The Willows scorecard, both players scoring 51, with Louie Garry not out at the end. The balance of The Willows batsmen were guilty of not applying themselves, in batting conditions that are always favourable.

For Nelson College, it was a strong bowling & fielding effort, and if they had held onto the chances offered The Willows scorecard would have been much worse. The standout bowler for Nelson College was Niall McCleod who bowled superbly for his 5-35 from 9.4 overs, his effort in essence set up the Nelson victory, he was well supported by G Aerakis who took 3-2 from 6 overs.









185 was never going to be enough for The Willows XI to defend, on the excellent Willows batting surface, and Nelson College made a very strong start with a 77- run opening partnership, with J Nicolls scoring 78, and H Ward supporting with a bright and breezy 54.

This start set the Nelson College up for victory, with D Kelso 31, Nelson College reached the target with 10 overs to spare.

A thoroughly commanding performance by Nelson College and a well-deserved victory for the second season running. Louie Garry topped off a good allround day with figures of 3-33 for The Willows. Our thanks must go to The Nelson College 1st XI, for the way in which they conducted themselves, their dress standards, and the spirit in which they played the match.

Prep started the year by welcoming the new Year 7 boys to the school with a haka on the front field and, as is our custom, a welcome handshake.








