academic

At the recent Arahi-Parent Video Conferences, you son's classes would have been discussed. If you need more time to go through their goals, progress or course, please email their Arahi teacher or their class teacher. Feel free to contact me, and I will put you in touch with the right people. We have started to establish routines for Prep-Time. The seniors should have NCEA work to go through.

The juniors do not always have enough homework to fill the hour. To make prep more meaningful for the juniors, once a week I will go through the Common Assessment tasks needed for NCEA. These are numeracy and Literacy assessments. All students will need to pass these in order to get NCEA. Once sat and passed, they do not need to do them again.

Students start sitting these in May and then another attempt in September. These are for Year 10 and above and only for those that have not passed. Most boys get them throughout Year 10 and 11. In addition to this we are also going to look at setting up Maths Buddy for the students, which is an online maths programme where students answer questions which are instantly marked. Tutorials come with each set of questions.

ncea results

Academic success is fundamental at Nelson College, and I am pleased to share the NZ Domestic Boarders' NCEA results from Last year. A number of boys worked extremely hard for their results and should be proud of their achievement. Overall pass rates are much higher than the rest of the school and nationally. We will look to support Boarder's to achieve more Merit and Excellence endorsements.
