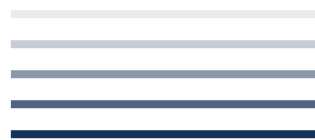

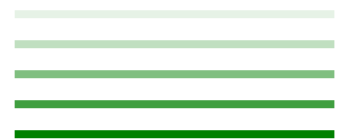

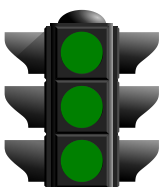
JUST GO! Getting Behind School Attendance in 2025!

We've enjoyed welcoming our students back and meeting some new ones too!

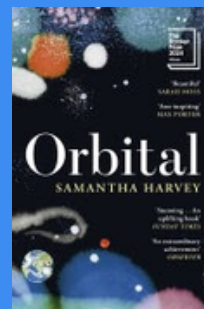

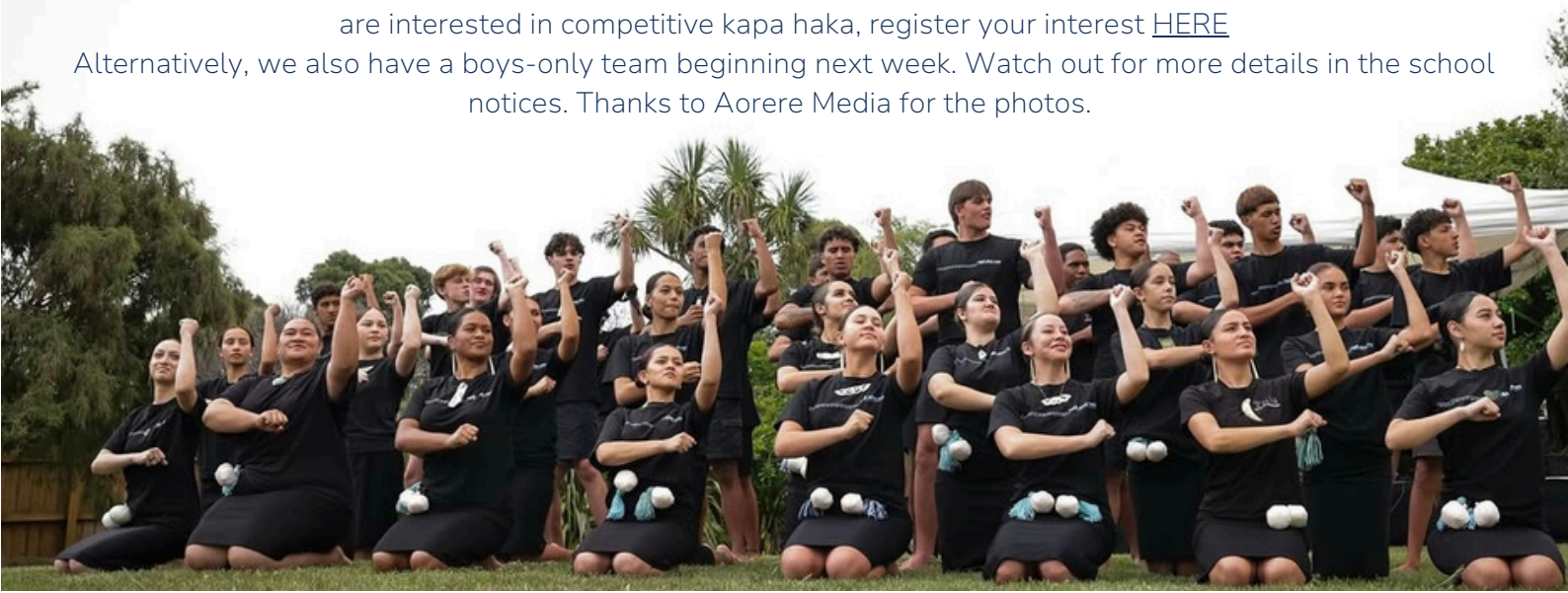


ngā aho rau waitangi day performance

Willows Trip:

The 1st XI had a great trip for the annual Willows trip. They tied against Timaru Boys, both getting 245 runs despite Tommy Mclean getting four wickets and Kurt Ward scoring 98 runs! They lost against a very strong Willows XI that was put together despite a half-century by Jarryd Nicholls. The boys also lost to St Thomas's however Dallas Kelso picked up six wickets in the match.

Nelson Saturday Cricket:

The team narrowly missed out on a semi-final with overall net run rate proving the difference between 4th place and 5th where we finished. We needed a win with a bonus point against ACOB on Saturday and we did defend 130, winning by 22 runs - However to get the bonus point we needed to get them out under 105 runs... So close...And a great never-give-up attitude against a good side. The team has now beaten every team in the competition once which is a milestone, and a huge improvement from last season.

The 1st XI also won the Congdon Shield and will hold it for the season, the 1st time in Nelson College history.

We now finish off the season with the T20 competition to which the 1st XI won their first match against ACOB in the last over.

Over the course of this season multiple boys have received their special baggy cap which represents 50+ games for the 1st XI - Well done gents.

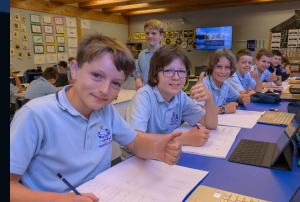


tessa quayle sings at opera in the park

ROBOTICS CAMPS



Introduction

If you enjoy building kits, Lego, getting robots to work, gaming or coding then this opportunity is for you!

You will get to experience and learn:

- mechanical principles by building a number of robotic vehicles
- programming in block and C++ languages needed to control a robotic vehicle,
- engineering designing while creating a purpose built robotic vehicle
- competitive strategizing in robotic quizzes and vehicle challenges.
- team project management, record keeping, time management and teamwork.

FUNDAMENTAL ROBOTICS CAMPS



Description and Cost

Open to all ages. The first camp(2 hours) is \$30 and is intended as a taster. Should it meet with your approval, further 3 hour camps, each second Saturday afternoon, will be a fee of \$60 each. This will cover the hiring of the Competition VEX Kits and coaching time.

COMPETITION ROBOTICS CAMPS



Description

This camp may be for you if you were **born after 1st May 2010** and **wish to form one of the teams** that will represent the school at National Vex IQ Robotics Competition (VIQRC) at the end of the year.

Cost

To attend these camps, you need to **find 2 or 3 other students to share the cost of purchasing a Competition VEX Kit**, as shown, that costs approximately \$1000.

As a team, you will immediately begin to design and build the robot that you believe will win the competition!

While your kit will be stored at school and used by you during a camp, **your team**

will also be able to take the kit home to work on. Once the competition is over, you may sell your share to another student or enter again the next year.

These camps are normally **2 to 3 hour camps held on Saturday or Sunday fortnightly** throughout the term and year. Coaching will also further develop your mechanical and coding skills and cost \$15 per hour.

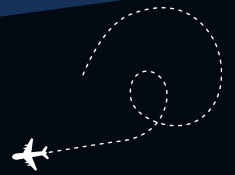

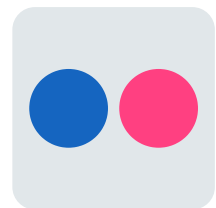
