This relationship began with us as their first New Zealand partner school! Each year, Vajiravudh sends 2-3 students to us through their overseas cultural programme, joining a network that includes Auckland Grammar, New Plymouth, Otago Boys, and Macleans.

This year, we're thrilled to welcome seven of their students—five here for the year and two boys who've chosen to leave their school and join us full-time, a significant milestone for both schools.
